



“Blending of Blood” Photography exhibition

Penang has 1.2 million people, more than half of whom live on the island. The population is ethnically split between Chinese, Malays and Indians, the largest of the three groups being the Chinese followed by the Malays. The diversity of ethnic backgrounds in Penang has led to various types of ethnic mixes existing in Penang. Today, Penang has a sizeable expatriate population especially from Japan, various Asian countries and Britain, many of whom settle in Penang after their retirement.
